Income from U.S. Government Obligations

Some states do not tax their residents on income from a mutual fund that is earned from U.S. Government Obligations. The following table shows the percentage of total ordinary income dividends shown in Box 1 of your 2019 Tax Form that were attributable to interest earned from direct U.S. Government Obligations:
